Objects could range from sporting wear, headphones, cameras, old toys, footwear, keys etc</p>	<p>Consider more than just your face to represent you in the photographs. Explore a range of angles, distances, shadows and facial expressions</p> <p>Want to do additional, explore a range of APPs that will alter the appearance of your image or try using a variety of filters</p> <p>(DO NOT POUT ON ALL OF YOUR PHOTOGRAPHS!!!!!!)</p>
