What will I be learning about in this Learning Programme? I will learn about articles and reports. I will be looking at how writers have used a variety of techniques to clearly show and argue their own opinions. I will then be using this knowledge in my own work, in order to write effective articles that persuade my reader to agree with my point.			
Where have I seen this learning before? Having studied poetry will have given you a basis in being to identify a writers bias and looking for their opinion. Analysing short stories will have shown you how to look for key techniques, and how to take them and apply them in your own writing.			
What could I use it for? Having to effectively argue your views and opinions are a key part of everyday life. It is also important that you are able to identify if a news article is trustworthy, and whether it has any biased or not. The skills of researching a topic and being able to use facts in order to effectively argue points will also be essential in the world of work.
